

A Note from the Board of Selectmen Regarding the Bristol-Plymouth District-Wide Election and Rehoboth Override/Debt-Exclusion Ballot Question

Residents of Rehoboth ~ On March 5th, you are being asked to go to the polls (at the new Francis Farm central polling location) to vote on an important issue presented to the town: the request from the Bristol-Plymouth Regional Technical School ("BP") to build a new 300+ million-dollar facility in Taunton. BP is a regional school district, which we are a member of.

When you go to the polls on the 5th, you will be handed two ballots. The first ballot asks you to approve or not approve BP's building project. The second ballot asks you to fund Rehoboth's portion of the project, should it pass, via a debt exclusion.

There are seven member communities of the BP district: Berkley, Bridgewater, Dighton, Middleboro, Raynham, Rehoboth, and Taunton. For the project to be approved, a simple majority of combined voters from *all* towns who participate in the BP district must vote to approve the project. This means even if a town overwhelmingly votes to reject the project, if the project receives a majority vote overall when adding the votes together from all the communities, the project still passes, and all member communities – even those who reject it – must pay for the project. This is different from our own regional high school with Dighton where a capital project at the high school must pass both towns in order to continue.

If BP's project request is approved, how each member community chooses to pay for its share of the project is entirely up to the community. Some communities may choose to pay for its share within its regular tax levy. Other communities, such as Rehoboth, will have to ask for a debt exclusion, as we have no excess levy capacity we can use to pay for the project. Without the additional monies raised via a debt-exclusion, if the project passes, we would still have to find the money somewhere to pay for our portion of the project. Those of you who attend Town Meetings would need to decide how to fund this project (e.g., where to reduce other appropriations to free up monies for the BP assessment.) **There are four possible scenarios from voting on the 5th.**

Project Ballot	Debt Exclusion	What it Means
Passes	Passes	The project is approved and will move forward. When the BP District sends us a capital assessment to pay for the new facility, it will be funded via a property tax increase. The term of this debt exclusion is 30 years. The payment the town will need to make annually will be based on the number of students from the town enrolled in BP.
Passes	Fails	The project is approved and will move forward. When the BP District sends us a capital assessment for our portion of the new facility, the town is obligated to pay it. Without the debt exclusion, the town will have to pay the additional charges out of its regular tax levy, which means the town will likely need to make cuts to its operating budget, or to the amount it pays to the DR Regional School District.
Fails	Passes	The project is not approved and even though the debt exclusion passes there is no increase in taxes because the project failed to gain approval from the member communities. The debt exclusion question becomes a moot issue for all practical purposes.
Fails	Fails	The project is not approved and as with the above example the debt exclusion question is a moot issue. There will be no tax increase.

Continued Message from Rehoboth Board of Selectmen

The Board of Selectmen, as the elected executive board of the Town of Rehoboth, does not take a position either for or against either of the questions you will be presented with on the 5th. Rather, it is our responsibility to make you aware of the questions and their impact on the town and its residents.

Hopefully you will find these sources adequate to aid you in making a decision to approve or disapprove BP's request.

There are a couple of common questions people have asked the Selectmen regarding this project. I will attempt to address some of these briefly at this time.

The most common question was: "**How much will my taxes go up?**" With this project, this question is difficult to answer. The amount the town pays annually to BP depends on the number of students we have enrolled at the school. Although we can calculate a figure based the number of students we have at BP today, this number will vary – both up or down – on a yearly basis. The amount you pay will also vary annually based on your property's assessed value – if your assessed value changes, you will pay more or less depending on the change.

This said, if we look at an "average" home in Rehoboth, valued at \$402,000, that "average" homeowner could expect (based on how many students we currently have enrolled in BP this year) to see a \$99.81 annual increase (\$24.95/quarter) on their property tax bill.

The second question was: "Is this a permanent increase?" In this case, the answer is no. The term for the debt exclusion is 30 years. After 30 years, it will come off the property tax bill. This is different than a Proposition 2 ½ override, which is a permanent increase.

The third question people asked revolved around the wording of the debt-exclusion ballot question itself. "Why doesn't it say for how long? This means it could be forever!" and "Why doesn't it have an amount? It is like writing a blank check!" Unfortunately, the wording of the debt exclusion question is dictated by Massachusetts General Law, it isn't something either the Town Clerk or the Selectmen can modify. The term and amount unfortunately do not appear on the ballot. These values are usually voted on by Town Meeting (for a town-related debt-exclusion). In this case, by the BP school committee voted for the term and amount, prior to making it to the ballot question.

The final question people have asked is: "What happens if we vote yes for the debt exclusion but the project doesn't pass? Will our taxes still go up?" The answer in this case is "no". The debt exclusion is exclusively for the BP project. If the BP project fails to pass the debt exclusion becomes a moot issue, as there is no longer a project to fund. The debt exclusion you are voting on March 5th cannot be used for anything else other than the BP project.

Please take the time to come out and vote on the 5th! If you have further questions, do not hesitate to reach out to either myself, the Town Clerk, or another member of the Board of Selectmen.

On November 1, 2021 the Rehoboth Board of Selectmen voted to designate the newly acquired Francis Farm Community Complex "Museum" building as Rehoboth's "Centralized Voting Location", rather than holding our elections at a local school gymnasium due to student safety concerns raised by our local school committee. In addition, effective December 31, 2021 Rehoboth was required by law to move from three (3) precincts to four (4) precincts as a result of the Town's population as recorded in the 2020 Federal Census results. Using the Francis Farm Community Complex Museum as Rehoboth's Centralized Polling Location is intended to address the concerns of the School Committee and to avoid voter confusion over where to vote. All four (4) precincts will be voting at the same facility.

RETURN OF ABSENTEE BALLOTS

Ballots mailed from our office include a white return ballot envelope that is addressed to the Town Clerk's Office. You may return your ballot by mail (please see deadlines on previous page) or hand deliver your ballot by placing it in the ballot drop box outside of the Town Offices (deadline is close of polls on Election Day). Please Note: Ballots CANNOT be returned to the polling location on Election Day - they must be returned to the Town Clerk's Office/Outside Drop Box for processing.

1. Am I a registered voter, what is my precinct & what is my party enrollment?

2. Is my voter status "active"?

Per state law, voters must return their signed street list census forms annually to the Town Clerk's office to maintain an active voter status. **Inactive voters are still eligible to vote** but will be required to complete additional forms and show an ID at the polls in order to vote. **Check your <u>voter status</u> online at:**




Pavilion Area Overflow Voter Queueing Area

Do you approve of the vote of the Regional District School Committee of the Bristol-Plymouth Regional Vocational Technical School District, adopted on November 3, 2021, to authorize the borrowing of \$305,567,432 to pay costs of designing, constructing, originally equipping and furnishing a new District high school to be located at 207 Hart Street, Taunton, including the payment of all costs incidental or related thereto, which vote provides, in relevant part, as follows:

"VOTED: That the Bristol-Plymouth Regional Vocational Technical High School District (the "District") hereby appropriates the amount of \$305,567,432 for the purpose of paying costs of designing, constructing, originally equipping and furnishing a new District high school to be located at 207 Hart Street, Taunton, including the payment of all costs incidental or related thereto (the "Project"), which school facility shall have an anticipated useful life as an educational facility for the instruction of school children of at least 50 years, and for which the District may be eligible for a school construction grant from the Massachusetts School Building Authority ("MSBA"), said amount to be expended at the direction of the School Building Committee. To meet this appropriation the District is authorized to borrow said amount, under and pursuant to Chapter 751, Section 6(d) of the Acts of 1965, as amended, G.L. c. 71, §16(n) as authorized by G.L. c. 71, §14D, and the District Agreement, as amended, or pursuant to any other enabling authority. The District acknowledges that the MSBA's grant program is a non-entitlement, discretionary program based on need as determined by the MSBA, and any Project costs the District incurs in excess of any grant approved by and received from the MSBA shall be the sole responsibility of the District; provided further that any grant that the District may receive from the MSBA shall not exceed the lesser of (1) sixty-two and twenty-five hundredths percent (62.25%) of eligible, approved Project costs, as determined by the MSBA, and (2) the total maximum grant amount determined by the MSBA, and that the amount of borrowing authorized pursuant to this vote shall be reduced by any grant amount set forth in the Project Funding Agreement that may be executed between the District and the MSBA. Any premium received upon the sale of any bonds or notes approved by this vote, less any such premium applied to the payment of the costs of issuance of such bonds or notes, may be applied to the payment

The debt authorized by this vote of the Committee shall be submitted to the registered voters of the District's member towns and the City of Taunton for approval at a District-wide election to be held on March 5, 2022 in accordance with the provisions of G.L. c. 71, §14D and G.L. c. 71, §16(n) and the District Agreement."


