Greetings:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town aforesaid who are qualified to vote in Elections and Town Affairs, therein, to meet at Francis Farm-Museum Building, on Tuesday, November 7, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. to act on the following **Special Town Meeting** articles:

ARTICLE 1: AUTHORIZATION TO USE CAPTIAL STABLIZATION OR OTHER SOURCE FOR SENIOR CENTER CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS SUBMITTED BY: BOARD OF SELECTMEN

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and transfer, from the Capital Stabilization Fund, the sum of \$759,814.80, to address various needs for Senior Center facilities including, without limitation: roof repair/replacement, signage, repairs & expansion of parking lots, enhancements to interior spaces and other capital improvements, along with maintenance of the facility, as it relates to the rebuilding, renovating and maintaining of the Senior Center and the needs of the seniors; or take any other action relative thereto.

___Approved ___Disapproved Finance Committee Recommends: At Town Meeting Source of Funds: Capital Stabilization \$759,814.80

<u>Comments:</u> The amount of \$759,814.80 represents the net balance from the insurance proceeds for the insurance settlement of the former Council on Aging building. This will be used specifically for the rebuilding and renovating as well as maintenance and repair of the Council on Aging complex. This article will ensure funds are available for any unforeseen or emergency type of repairs as needed or changes due to services offered to the seniors. This requires 2/3rd majority vote.

ARTICLE 2: PEG ACCESS AND CABLE FUND PURSUANT MGL C. 44 S. 53F 3/4 SUBMITTED BY: BOARD OF SELECTMEN

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate, pursuant to MGL C. 44, S. 53F ³/₄, \$601,893 from the PEG Access and Cable Fund for the purpose of supporting cable access services for the Town of Rehoboth; or take any other action relative thereto.

<u>Comments:</u> This article ensures the Town's compliance to MGL C. 44 S. 53 ¾ for both FY23 expenditures and FY24 budget for the PEG and Cable Access operations.

ARTICLE 4: BOARD OF HEALTH-TRANSFER STATION OFFSET RECEIPTS SUBMITTED BY: BOARD OF HEALTH

To see if the Town will vote to amend Article 5 from the 2023 Annual Town Meeting to reauthorize an "offset receipts" account for the Solid Waste Handling Facility and Recycling Area and its operation pursuant to MGL C. 44 S. 53E. Fees collected for the use of the Solid Waste Handling Facility and Recycling Area will be deposited in this fund. The account shall be for the expenses and improvements incurred for the operation, maintenance, monitoring and / or compliance requirements of the Solid Waste Handling Facility and Recycling Area. The Fiscal Year 2024 expenditures shall be increased from the estimated amount of \$148,700.00 to a new amount of \$152,400.00. All expenditures are to be authorized by the Board of Health, or take any other action relative thereto.

<u>Comments</u>: The operation of the Transfer Station is estimated to cost \$152,400.00 in FY24 and will be funded by pay-as-you-throw fees. This is an amendment from the 2023 Annual Town Meeting in May.

ARTICLE 5: ACCEPTANCE OF THE DONATION OF THE "THE CORN CRIB" SUBMITTED BY: HISTORICAL COMMISSION

To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to acquire by gift from the owner, George Handy of Fine Farm, the land and buildings of that property known as The Corn Crib located at the intersection of Tremont St. and Anawan St., further identified as Assessors' Map 71, Lot 37 more or less, which shall include the corn crib structure and that portion of Assessors' Map 71, Lot 37, as determined by the Board of Selectmen to be in the best interest of the Town as aforesaid, said property to be used for general municipal purposes and further to authorize the Board of Selectmen

acquire by gift any and all easements appurtenant and necessary therefore and to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the same; and further to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds \$4,200 for surveying costs said property; or take any other action relative thereto **Historical Commission Recommends: Approval** Approved Disapproved **Finance Committee Recommends: At Town Meeting Source of Funds: At Town Meeting Comments:** The Rehoboth Historical Commission would like the town to approve the acceptance of the donation of The Corn Crib and the parcel of land. It is a landmark in this town and deserves to be preserved. It is also a great reminder of the importance of the farming community in this town. ARTICLE 6: GENERAL BYLAWS AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER A-ARTICLE IV-TOWN OFFICIALS-APPOINTED-SECTION 3A-CONSERVATION COMMISSION SUBMITTED BY: CONSERVATION COMMISSION To see if the Town will vote to amend Article IV, Section 3A of the Town's General Bylaws by adding the following sentence at the end of such section: "The Conservation Commission may appoint up to 2 non-voting associate members to the Commission"; or take any other action relative thereto. **Conservation Commission Recommends: Approval** Approved Disapproved ARTICLE 7: AMEND LANGUAGE ON AGREEMENT BETWEEN TOR AND SOUTH FIRE STATION ASSOCIATION SUBMITTED BY: BOARD OF SELECTMEN To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to convey the property located at Martin Street, Rehoboth, MA, the same premises as described on Assessors' Valuation Book for 1952, Page 73, Line 3, as more specifically described in the deed 2230, Pg. 327 recorded in the Bristol County Registry of Deeds, subject to all easements and restrictions of record, for such consideration as the Board of Selectmen deems to be in the best interest of the Town and subject to the requirements of MGL C. 30B, the Uniform Procurement Act, or take any other relative action thereto. **Approved Disapproved Board of Selectmen Recommends: Approval**

<u>Comments:</u> A comprehensive easement for the benefit of the South Rehoboth Fire Association, Inc. was granted from the town in 1982, which provides the South Rehoboth Fire Association, Inc. the right to use, occupy, income and improve the premises. If the South Rehoboth Fire Association, Inc. is the winning bidder in the procurement process, the full fee interest in the property may be conveyed to it.
